

Internet & Mobile Phone Safety Quiz - The Answers

On The Internet

1. Safe Surfing

You should always be careful when surfing the internet. Some of the information on the internet is simply not true, so you need to check it carefully. You can check out other websites, or check in books, or ask someone you trust what they think. So, the correct answer to the question is... **all of the above**.

2. Search Filters

Some things you come across on the internet can be very unpleasant and might really upset you. If this happens, you should always... **tell someone who can help (a parent or carer, or your teacher)**.

3. Digital Footprints

The correct answer to this question is... **Internet Protocol Address**.

4. Online Gaming & Chat

If someone asked you to print out a poster with all of your personal details on it (name, address, telephone number, email address and your bank account details) and then put that poster up in every shop window in the main street of the place where you live, would you do it? It wouldn't be a good idea, would it? It's the same on the internet... personal details should always be just that: personal. Therefore, it's much safer to use... **a nickname that won't give away any personal details**.

5. Music

If you download music or video files that are not legal, you're breaking the law. And, without even knowing it, you could also be downloading something you don't want on your computer, like a virus, or something even more unpleasant.

Some P2P (peer to peer) programmes come with extra software, called spyware, which can pass on your personal details to marketing companies or someone even more nasty.

You should always remember... **some files are not what they say they are**.

6. Social Networking

The terms and conditions you have to agree to, if you sign up to Facebook, state that you must be... **at least 13 years of age.**

7. Bluetoothing

Uploading is how you transfer data (images, music, etc.) from your computer to, for instance, a website where it will be stored. Downloading is when you transfer data from a website to your computer. If you transfer similar data from your mobile phone to another mobile phone, using Bluetooth, it's called... **sideloading.**

8. Texting

Most mobile phones these days have common words stored in their memory, so, when you start to text, it guesses (or predicts) what it thinks you want to say. This is called... **predictive texting.**

9. Bullying

If you start getting annoying, nasty or rude texts, remember, don't reply, but keep a record of it. If any of these things bother you, talk to an adult you trust or report it to your school or mobile phone operator. So the right answer is... **don't reply but save the text and show it to someone who you trust.**
